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Joint Project with PCCAT: Updating the National Transcript Guide and Creating a Transfer and Mobility Nomenclature Database

In March 2003, ARUCC published its National Transcript Guide after more than a year of consultation with colleagues across Canada. It has served as a resource for our professional community for more than ten years. It's hard to believe a decade has passed so quickly. As you know, much has changed since 2003 and it is now time to take red ink to the old guidelines, revising them to suit the times.

Collaboration with PCCAT

This time, there is another opportunity: the Pan-Canadian Consortium on Admissions and Transfer (PCCAT) also had plans to develop guidelines, but focused on transfer and mobility nomenclature. Given the significant overlap between the work of the ARUCC community and the mandate of PCCAT's project, it made sense to collaborate. The two organizations have struck a Memorandum of Understanding to govern a joint project. The deliverables will be a searchable database of transcript practices and Canadian transfer credit nomenclature. An RFP was launched in October and the Project Steering Committee will select a contractor soon.

National and Regional Support

The Project is being supported financially and in kind by a number of regional and national organizations. They include: the British Columbia Council on Admission and Transfer, the New Brunswick Council on Articulations and Transfer, Campus Manitoba, the Ontario Council on Articulation and Transfer, ARUCC, and PCCAT.

Consultation and Timing

Practices and terminology in these areas are almost as diverse as the membership of both organizations. This means that there will be several months of consultation in the first phase of the project, which will begin in December 2013. Consultation activities will include a national survey, consultation during regional meetings, and institutional interviews. The Project Team may also request a sample of your institutional official transcripts.

The timeline for completion of this first phase is March 31, 2014. A presentation of the findings will be made at ARUCC 2014 in Quebec City.

We invite you to participate actively and enthusiastically so that your institution's practices and terminology are reflected in the final report.

AACRAO SPEEDE Committee Update: Fall 2013

The AACRAO Committee for Standardization of Postsecondary Education Electronic Data Exchange (SPEEDE) coordinates and leads the development of these national exchange standards by representing postsecondary education in the appropriate standards setting bodies. These include the Postsecondary Electronic Standards Council (PESC) and American National Standards Institute (ANSI) Accredited Standards Committee (ASC) X12.

2013 been a busy year for the SPEEDE Committee, having presented on data standards and data exchange at the following events: the AACRAO 2013 Annual Meeting, the PESC 2013 Spring Data Summit, the AACRAO 2013 Technology Conference, and the PACRAO 2013 Fall Conference. The PACRAO conference was in place of the PESC Fall Data Summit. SPEEDE continues to re-focus its EDX educational "marketing" efforts by attending one PESC and one Regional Registrar's event each year. The conferences will depend on the time of year, targeted region and travel funds available.

In terms of on-going SPEEDE and PESC work items, SPEEDE developed, hosted and summarized a survey of North American higher ed institutions on PDF Transcript best practices, the results of which were published by AACRAO and will be available soon on AACRAO's newly redesigned web site. In addition, the Texas Server to National Student Clearinghouse transition occurred during the weekend of October 12 - 13, 2013. The committee also continues to field questions from institutions, organizations, vendors and exchange services interested in exchanging standardized electronic academic records.

CICIC Credential Assessment Project – *Building Bridges*

The Canadian Information Centre for International Credentials (CICIC) is pleased to announce that it is undertaking a new project entitled "Building Bridges: Consistency, Portability and Capacity of International Academic Credential Assessment in Canada," resuming the work begun as part of the "Pan-Canadian Quality Standards in International Academic Credential Assessment: Phase I and Phase II".

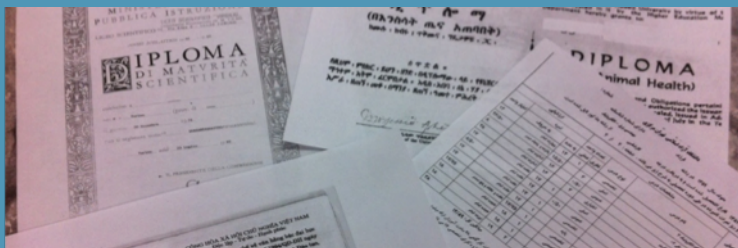
In Phases I and II, CICIC developed a number of reference tools to support assessors in their evaluation of international academic credentials for either admission purposes into Canadian colleges and universities or integration of internationally trained newcomers in the workforce. These tools include a Pan-Canadian Quality Assurance Framework for the Assessment of International Academic Credentials, Terminology Guides for Academic Credential Assessment in Canada, and a Competency Profile for an Academic Assessor. In Phase III, the Building Bridges project will consist of four main elements, which focus on strengthening consistency of academic credential assessments and capacity-building:

- implementing the Pan-Canadian Quality Assurance Framework for the Assessment of International Academic Credentials, including the creation of a steering committee;
- developing comparability tables of assessment outcomes for up to 12 countries;
- piloting an on-line course for academic credential assessors; and
- hosting webinars on key topics related to academic credential assessment.

CICIC is grateful to the Government of Canada's Foreign Credential Recognition Program for its support of the project.

TAICEP – The Association of International Credential Evaluation Professionals

For a number of years, informal groups of international credential evaluators around the world have been discussing the need for a new professional association. The Association of International Credential Evaluation Professionals (TAICEP) was established in 2013 to meet the unique goals of the profession of international credential evaluation. Members will have a place to develop their knowledge and skills, interact with colleagues from around the world and contribute to the professionalism of their field.

In October 2013, TAICEP held its inaugural symposium in Boston, MA, with representatives from Europe, the USA and Canada to determine the structure and activities this new organization would undertake. The Canadian contingent included Canadian universities, one regulatory body and the Canadian Information Centre for International Credentials. TAICEP will be governed by a Transition Committee until early 2014, when it is expected that a new governing body will be established.
