Context



Challenges

- Diverse nature of the academic credential assessment environment in Canada
- Newcomers may not have their academic credentials fully or consistently recognized for work or study in Canada.
- The newcomer, the employer in need of skilled employees, and the Canadian economy all suffer.

Goal of the Project



- To integrate internationally trained newcomers into the workforce in both regulated and unregulated professions
- To facilitate the assessment of academic credentials for foreign students' admission to Canadian colleges and universities.



Project



In 2007, CICIC began work on a multi-year project to improve the consistency and portability of academic credential assessments conducted in Canada, and to strengthen the capacity and the professionalization of the academic credential assessment field.

- Phase 1: 2007 Diagnostic research on the portability and consistency of academic credential assessments
- Phase 2: 2010 —Reference tools developed
